
# $\mathbf{DECEMBER 11, 2023}$ **BELL RINGER: ELEMENTS OF ART - COLOR**

## 1. Color: An element of art made up of three properties: hue, value, and intensity.

- Hue: another name for color
- Value: hue's lightness and darkness (color value changes when white or black is added)
- Intensity: quality of brightness
  - (high intensity= color is strong and bright; low intensity= color is faint and dull)


What shapes do you see in our example tree?



# PAPER ROLL TREES








Dip paper roll (circle!) in the bright colored paint at your table and stamp on paper.


Rotate tables and repeat with all colors to fill in your (triangle!) tree shape.





At your last table, paint your (rectangle!) tree trunk at the bottom of your tree.




COLORS THAT ARE NEIGHBORS ON THE COLOR WHEEL



# **DECEMBER 13, 2023 BELL RINGER: ELEMENTS OF ART - TEXTURE**

Texture: An element of art that refers to the way things feel, or look as if they might feel if touched.

### **Implied Texture:**

Implied texture, also known as visual texture, is only SEEN, not felt, by the viewer.

Artists use color, shape, light, shadow, and other 2D techniques to make something appear to have texture.

### **Actual Texture:**

Actual texture in art is real. If a viewer is allowed to touch a piece of artwork, it would feel how it looks: rough, bumpy, slimy, etc.,
